Thirty Questions on Radicalization: An Augmented Reality Book

The aim of the proposed project, entitled Thirty Questions on Radicalization (TQR) is to provide, by means of questions and answers, straight forward overviews (scientific and popular) on the phenomenon of radicalization among youth (i.e. causes and manifestations) as well as possible preventive measures. The final result of TQR will be an Augmented Reality Book (ARB): a printed book with embedded video files which can be viewed by pointing a mobile device (iPhones, iPads and high-powered Android devices) to the relevant pages.

As a sample of how Aurasma technology will be implemented in practice, we are including below (figure 1) a video recording featuring an interview with Professor Ruard Ganzevoort, Member of the Dutch Senate and Dean at VU University Amsterdam.
